# **Quarterly Gold Canyon Transportation & Safety Update**

#### GCCI - December 2023

Thank you for taking the time to read about transportation and safety progress and upcoming plans for Gold Canyon. This is a quick summary of planned and recent activity in our Community.

Please let us know of other transportation items you would like to hear about or discuss in future updates.

## Planning Items - Transportation

- 1. There will be a community meeting on <u>December 14, 5:00 pm</u> at the Gold Canyon Golf and Country Club to review the progress and early results of the very important <u>Gold Canyon</u> Transportation Study.
  - The study will include a review of the need for safer <u>eastbound left turn lanes</u> at Superstition Mountain; Mountainbrook and Kings' Ranch Road intersections.
  - It will include safety and circulation improvements within Gold Canyon such as the concept to <u>widen Kings' Ranch Road</u> northward beyond Alhambra to provide end-to-end shoulders with striping to make it safer for pedestrians and cyclists.
  - It will address options to improve traffic flow during the **Renaissance Festival**.
- 2. The site planning for the new <u>Maverik service station</u> at the corner of Kings' Ranch Road and US-60 is progressing and includes:
  - A second northbound lane on Kings' Ranch Road, starting at Walgreen's.
  - A median along Kings' Ranch Road between the station and Walgreen's
  - Traffic studies indicate a 2<sup>nd</sup> left turn lane off eastbound US-60 at Kings Ranch Road is needed.
- 3. Planning has begun for another service station on the south side of US-60
- 4. The <u>Peralta Trail paving project</u> from Peralta Canyons to the Peralta Trailhead is scheduled for 2025-6. This will be completed with Federal funds.
- 5. Funding to <u>provide overpasses along SR-24</u> from Ellsworth to Ironwood is taking priority over funding to extend SR-24 to connect US-60 south of the Renaissance property.
- 6. The North-South corridor highway being planned from US-60/Goldfield to Picacho Peak will be designated **Hwy 505**.

# **Planning Items - Trails**

- 1. A request is being developed to request a <u>safe right-of-way pedestrian and cycling trail</u> from the Peralta School to the new Regional Park.
- 2. GCCl is partnering with Apache Junction and the County to develop a <u>multi-use trail</u> <u>between S. Goldfield Road and S. Superstition Mountain Drive</u>.

# Gold Canyon - Safety Items

- 1. A community meeting was held to explain the options for speed and safety improvement along Sleepy Hollow. The next step is a targeted neighborhood survey.
  - The design for a <u>right-hand turn lane off Kings' Ranch Road</u> to Sleepy Hollow is completed.
  - There is a need to expand the shoulder at the west end (north side) of Sleepy Hollow towards Kings' Ranch Road to improve pedestrian and cyclist safety
- 2. The new "pedestrian activated" signal crosswalk <u>between the United Methodist Church</u> <u>and their Mission Center</u> and Food bank on Kings' Ranch Road is in its final stages
- 3. The proposal for a roundabout or other traffic solutions was not approved at the intersection **between the 2 Peralta Trails HOA's**. Is this a candidate for a flashing pedestrian activated signal crosswalk?
- 4. A known safety issue at the Intersection of **Don Donnelly and Superstition Boulevard** will be brought to the TAC (Transportation Advisory Committee) for intersection redesign.
- 5. ADOT has brought on a new contractor to provide <u>litter cleanup</u> along US-60 and other Pinal and Maricopa highways.
